# FLY OF THE MONTH by Terry Eggleston

# GREEN BUTT SKUNK

Hook: 36890 mustad or Eagle Claw 1197 sizes 1 - 8

Thread: Black 3/0 monocord

Tag: Silver tinsel

Tail: Red hackle fibers
Ribbing: Oval silver tinsel

Body: Black chenille with florescent green chenille tied in

at the butt

Hackle: White bucktail (or if you have it, polar bear)

## Instructions:

- 1. Leave space for head, wrap about 10 to 15 wraps of #2 amp fuse wire (.026).
- 2. Lay a base of black 3/0 thread from back of head space to just above the barb and attach silver tinsel for tag, make 4 wraps of tinsel and tie off.
- 3. Tie in about 1/4" of red hackle fibers for a tail.
- 4. Attach florescent green chenille, make 2 to 3 wraps to form butt and tie off.
- 5. Attach oval silver tinsel for ribbing and then rib body with silver tinsel and tie off.
- 6. Attach black hackle by the tip and make 4 to 5 turns to form a wet style collar.
- 7. Attach white bucktail (or polar bear) for wing. Wing should end no longer than bend of hook. For a little extra flash, you can add 4 to 6 strands of pearl crystal hair.
- 8. Finish off with a neat head and 2 coats of head finish.

#### WINTER TROUT DERBY


