SUBJECT: The Fly Shop is offering limited access to Upper Fall River

Fall River is recognized as one of the jewels in the California's "Wild Trout Program". This unique and pristine waterway is one of the finest dry fly, spring creek experiences in the western United States, and unfortunately is beyond the reach of many of fly fishermen.

Public access to the river is limited to the Cal Trout location at Island Bridge Road, on the lower third of the River, and the only access on the scenic Upper Fall River (commercial or otherwise) has been limited to guests staying at Rick's Lodge. Moreover, since wading is impossible and bank fishing is considered trespassing, Fall River fishing requires low-profile boats, equipped with high-torque electric motors and several batteries for power, an expensive investment for an occasional use!

In the 1989 trout season, The Fly Shop is offering very limited access to the river through the location it has used to service its guide clientele for the last 9 years. No launching of private boats will be allowed. Reservation for either of the two deluxe 14' Western prams, each outfitted with electric motor, deep-cycle batteries, oars, and anchor may be made by calling (916) 222-3555.

Price for the boat rental and access fee to this unique and pristine trout fishery is \$60 per day.

August 26 Fishout with Jim Victorine

Jim Victorine will be the fishmaster for Lake Clementine on August 26. Jim gave these deatils for the outing. We will meet at 5:00 am at Denny's in Newcastle (take the Newcastle exit). We will depart Denny's promptly at 6:00 am. We should be on the water at 6:30 am. You will need a float tube or pram, 5/6 wt. rod, with a sink tip, 3/4 # tippet, size 6 or smaller flies, Jim suggests Janseen Minnows, Brown or Black Wolfy Buggers or leeches, Marabou Muddlers or streamers, small bass poppers can be used on the upper end of the lake. The technique Jim uses is cast as close to shore as possible or parallel cast the shore. We will have a great time and hope to see alot of you at this outing.

In August we will have a double feature for you! Mike Flannigan will be describing the fishing opportunities in the Trinity Alps and Ken Winkleblack will be showing a program on the Mokelumne River including slides of our club members on the first backpacking fishout. The Trinity Alps are a small mountain range in the northwestern portion of California (basically go to Redding and turn left) that are seldom visited, yet are very scenic with lots of small lakes and streams that feed the coastal rivers. There are both backcountry fishing opportunities and also many places you can drive to if you have patience and time to wind your way through the maze of small logging roads in the area. Mike Flanigan has just recently started a guide service in the Trinity Alps that grew out of a long standing private interest in the area. For those looking for a new place to try, not too far from home with very little fishing pressure, this program may interest you.

Ken's program will show two backcountry areas of the Mokelumne, one that is accessed from the Bear Valley area off Highway 104, and the other where our club fishout went around the Salt Springs Reservoir area off Highway 88. So come see some familiar faces tackling the wilds of the Mokelumne Wilderness in search of wild rainbow and brown trout.

Future programs include: Stann Hellekson on Fishing in Baja, Dave Howard on Stream Photography, and Ken Winkleblack on Fishing off the Highways and Byways of Alaska.
